


Scripture Diagram Graphics was born while I was in Africa. I realized, while trying to communicate the gospel to them, that they spoke English, but their comprehension of the gospel facts was very limited. Although I could outline a message and speak it to them, the clarity of understanding was absent in most cases. It was there that I hit upon the idea of using simple diagrams to illustrate the truths of sin and salvation. The response was phenomenal. I could see the lights come on as I diagramed the passage and spoke with them. On several occasions, I would get a response of them excitedly telling me the next point in the material BEFORE I had communicated it. They were understanding the truths of God's words!

In addition, I wanted a method of teaching a young Christian simple gospel truths that they in turn could communicate to their friends and begin witnessing with boldness. I taught a simple lesson on Romans 3:23 to David in just a few minutes and then watched as he took that lesson and taught another man, in his own language, the truths of sin that separates us from God. Eureka! This is very reproducible! The quality of the drawing is not the important part at all. In fact, if you desire to have others use it, you will find that not doing a great job will make them more confident in using the diagrams. One man in the US told me, 'Anybody could do better than that!' Precisely! You don't need to intimidate your disciple with the detail of your work, just show him the basics and let him take it from there. This is truly a discipleship tool that can yield tremendous results.

All around us are opportunities to use this method of communicating the gospel. The majority of our world are not readers. Readers communicate in a different way than those that are not readers. Non-readers think in pictures. They are Oral Communicators. Our world is in need of pictures to help communicate the gospel clearly. Whether

those pictures are painted in word pictures or on a piece of paper, the pictures will communicate volumes more to them than any finely reasoned argument ever could. Consider the following facts...

- 71% of those in the 10/40 window are oral communicators.
- 2/3 of our world prefer oral communication.
- 75% of the unreached population in the world are oral communicators.
- 95% of the women in Islamic countries are oral communicators.

Additionally, even in the USA where literacy is a high priority, 58% of those that graduate from High School will never read another book in their lifetime. 42% of those that graduate from College will never read another book after graduation.

Pictures speak volumes to this growing group of people. We need to find another way to communicate if we are going to get the gospel effectively to 'every creature.' (Mark 16:15) Diagrams provide a method that all people can grasp, from the highly educated to the uneducated. I have used diagrams with doctors and lawyers and have never had anyone offended at the method. Often you see the recognition of truth in their eyes as they 'see' what God is saying. The method has been used to communicate with children as well as those who have mild Alzheimer's. It has been effective with a wide variety of people.

What is even more encouraging is that you can remember what you need to communicate without detailed notes and outlines. You can adjust your presentation of gospel truth to the person you are communicating with as you interact with them.

The following diagrams can be used as a stand-alone, quick witness in a restaurant or any other setting. They can be drawn on a napkin or scrap of paper and given to the person to take with them as they consider the message you delivered. They can also be used in chronological order as a thorough presentation of the gospel from start to finish.





But just as surely as we will all die, we will one day bow before Almighty God. After death, every one of us will be judged by God.




"So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God." Romans 14:12 No other man will stand before God for you.



"But we are sure that the judgment of God is according to truth against them which commit such things."




"Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth." John 17:17








Other people go to the experts. They talk to religious authorities or read ancient writings. But we must remember that the experts are still human. I want to be sure that the experts I go to are right.




Some people believe things just because that is the way their parents taught them. They are trusting their never-dying soul to the customs and traditions that their family holds to.



The Bible is one of the many things on the sea of life that claims to be the answer. That doesn't necessarily make it the answer, but if it claims to be and the evidence points to it as the answer, then it is worth checking out. Is there evidence that supports the Bible?




The writers of this Book claimed to be eyewitnesses. (verse 16) They didn't just hear about something, they saw it with their own eyes. Just because they claimed they saw something doesn't make it true, but when three people see something (in this specific example, the Transfiguration) and are willing to give their lives for it, then you have something worth at least checking out.




There were miracles. (verse 17) In this case, they heard a booming voice come out of Heaven from the Father. The Bible is full of miracles, in both the Old and New Testaments. It is interesting to note that when miracles were done in people's hometown (for instance, a man blind from birth being healed in the town he lived his whole life), no one stood up to dispute the validity of those miracles.


People in that day knew that the miracles were real.



Now we can't go back and check up the experiences of other people, but we have a more sure word of prophecy. (verse 19) The Bible is full of prophecies, written hundreds of years before, and fulfilled exactly like they were written.




This Book claims to be the words of Almighty God, but God used human authors to put it together. (verse 21) 66 books, over 40 authors, separated by 3 continents, 1600 years, and varied educations...and no contradictions.



The Bible is our light shining in a dark place. (verse 19) It is the truth. The Bible is the lighthouse that lights our sea with the truth of God's Word. He did that for us because He cares about us and wants us to be ready for the day that we will stand before Him. He's given us the answers, and He's given us proof that His Book is what it claims to be.



The fifth commandment is "Thou shalt honor thy father and mother."


Have you always honored your parents as you should?


The seventh commandment is "Thou shalt not commit adultery." This includes the action of fornication, but also the thoughts of lust. (Matthew 5:28)


Jesus Christ is the glory of God. It is in His face that we see the glory of God.


John bore witness of Jesus.




The Father bore witness of Who Jesus was. Twice He authorized Jesus in a public manner by speaking from Heaven.








We are dead in sin. God is up in Heaven, and there is a cloud between us and God. Our sin has separated us from God. We can't get to Him.


That is why there are other religions--because men are always inventing ways to try to "get" to God.




When we are saved, we are no longer dead in our sins. There is no cloud between us and God.






But in verse 21, it tells us that we are enemies with God. We are alienated from God. We are enemies in our mind, which means the problem is with the way we think.




Before the Fall of man, Adam and Eve fellowshipped with God, and had a wonderful relationship with Him. But after the fall, they began thinking wrong thoughts.

They wanted to run their own life.






What is the easiest way to run your own life and have your own way? To have no God. They say, "There is no God," because they don't want to submit to God's authority. That is how people become atheists.


It all starts in the selfishness of their mind.






So as they are thinking wrong, they begin acting wrong. And the sins that they commit begin to build a wall between them and God. They are breaking the commandments of God. They lie.






God desires to reconcile us to Himself.








How are we reconciled to God? Through the blood of His cross! God didn't just tell me that He wants a relationship with me; He showed me by the cross.


Acts 20:21 FAITH



We have already discussed the necessity of repentance when a person is saved, but faith is also necessary. It is the second side of the coin. You can't truly have one without the other. Faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ. Our illustration is that of Blondon the Great, a world-renowned acrobat, who walked a tightrope across the Niagara Falls in 1859. He did many tricks across the tightrope, and many people were amazed by his skill. One time while a man was expressing his amazement to the Great Blondon, he was asked, "Do you think I could carry a man in this wheelbarrow across the tightrope?" The man was sure that he could, and wanted to see him do it, but when asked, "Will *you* get in the wheelbarrow?" he would not do it.


Acts 20:21 **FAITH** Acts 16:31

"And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house." Acts 16:31 That man may not have wanted to do it, but one of the Great Blondon's last stunts at Niagara Falls was carrying his promotion manager across on the tightrope. His manager had true faith.




Three things are needed for true faith: Thought, Feelings/Emotions, and our Choice.

Many people think about Christ, and they feel their need for Him, but they won't choose him--just as the man who refused to get in the wheelbarrow. He thought the Great Blondon was the greatest, he felt strongly that any person could trust in him, but he was unwilling to choose to get in the wheelbarrow.



The Gospel includes Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. These three things must be thought about. They must be felt. And every person must make a choice if he will accept or reject Christ's payment.



"But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead? Was not Abraham our father justified by works, when he had offered Isaac his son upon the altar?" James 2:20-21

True faith will evidence itself in the actions that we do.

If you do nothing with what you think and feel about Christ, then you do not have true saving faith.

The instructor should then draw a line from "Born Again" on the illustration to the point on his timeline where he was born again. After giving his testimony, the instructor should ask his student to draw their timeline, and then ask to be shown the point where the student was born again.
